JUNIOR GOLF PROGRAM

GOLF OVERVIEW

At Windermere Golf & Country Club, developing players and programs is not enough—the programs should have the right motives. It is our goal to provide your child with an understanding of golf's fundamentals, its etiquette and, of course, the pure enjoyment of the game that will last a lifetime in a friendly rewarding atmosphere. Our junior golf program has the potential to do a great deal more with our juniors than improve their golfing skills. The game of golf has exciting potential for personal growth and learning.

The backdrop for our junior golf program is the return of the CN Future Links program, which is Canada's national junior golf development series. Windermere is very excited to have partnered with this nationally recognized program. This national junior golf focused initiative is based on the collective efforts of the Canadian PGA, RCGA and Sport Canada with the purpose of delivering an enjoyable and educational golf program for junior players, parents and golf instructors. The program consists of multi-level instruction and provides clinics, camps, support materials and special programs to raise awareness of junior golf and addresses the issues of accessibility and affordability. It is our objective that each junior will have the opportunity to participate in this program that is specifically designed for them. The CN Future Links program is Canada's only recognized junior development program and has fostered greater cooperation between golf's governing bodies to promote the growth of the game from a grass roots level. We encourage each parent to visit their website at www.future-links.org.

If you are a junior interested in developing your golf game and enjoy having fun, Windermere Golf & Country Club in partnership with CN Future Links awaits your arrival.

CLINIC CURRICULUM

All instruction is based on a rotation basis. Each participant will learn the different aspects of the golf swing and all clinics will take place on the back nine, utilizing the 13th, 14th, and 15th holes as a range and short game facility. We also provide a "short course" consisting of holes 15 through 18. Each child will learn all the fundamentals which include body, stance, posture, alignment, ball position, short irons, long game, chipping, putting, scoring, rules, safety and etiquette.

The positive experiences suggested above are objectives that do not happen automatically when a youngster picks up a club and tours the course a few times. The claims that are made about golf, or any other sport, in respect to character development are not guaranteed. We believe that positive results are a product of purposeful effort, and by using our Future Links Program and the certified instructors involved, we can provide each junior the highest quality of personal instruction.

CURRICULUM

The programs are based on developing the fundamentals of our physical, emotional, mental and social qualities in the game of tennis. Individual and team skills will be woven into the curriculum and all situations of play will be covered. We will also focus on developing both leadership skills and team-oriented skills. Additionally, we incorporate the use of Tennis Canada's Progressive Tennis Curriculum in our youth programs.

THE INSTRUCTORS:

PATTI HENDERSON: Patti is excited to be returning to Windermere for her second season. Patti continues to enjoy the opportunity to share her knowledge and experience with the members and patrons of Windermere Golf and Country Club and Windermere House.

- **Junior Lesson Program:** The meat of our Junior Lesson Program remains quite similar to last year:

Monday/Wednesday/Friday

Tiny Tots ~ ages 4-5 (1:30–2:30PM)

Progressives ~ ages 6-9 (1:30–2:30PM)

Junior Intermediates ~ ages 10-12 (2:30–3:45PM)

Teens ~ ages 13-15 (3:45–5:00PM)

- **Tiny Tots:** This is for our youngest jr. members and covers age specific movement activities as well as tennis/racquet skills using progressive teaching methods. *
- **Progressives:** This is for our 6-9 year old jr. members and will increase the amount of tennis/racquet skills as well as introduce point play.
- **Jr. Intermediates:** A program for the 10-12 year old jr. members. We continue to build upon their racquet skills in a playing environment primarily.
- **Teens:** Geared for our young teens (ages 13-15) interested in playing and learning tennis.

This year's program will consist of a 4 week July program running July 4-July 29th. The second session will be a 3 week session from August 8-26th. The two 1 week breaks will allow for two rain date make-ups as well as the Jr. Team Tennis events for our enthusiastic young players or a 1 week break for those heading out of town or trying something different.

- **Junior Enthusiasts:** Perfect for the junior player who is developing a love and affinity for tennis. They are of an intermediate-advanced skill level and as such are able to sustain a rally on their own. They are self-motivated. They are falling in love with the game of tennis. We will focus on more advanced technical, tactical and emotional skills in a drilling/practicing environment. This program is run outside the traditional Jr. Program and acceptance to this program is through the Head Tennis Professional. It is held Tuesday mornings for 1.5 hrs. *

JR. INTER-CLUB WITH MUSKOKA LAKES GOLF AND COUNTRY CLUB: An opportunity for some of our Jr. members to compete with MLGCC Jr. members. *Windermere will be hosting this years event. Date: TBA.

HEAD-HEART-HANDS TEAM TENNIS TOURNAMENTS: A unique Team Tennis format designed for the novice competitor. These are tournaments created to encourage participation, play, fun and friendly competition in an age appropriate manner. These open tournaments will have priority registration for Windermere Jr. Members interested in playing

- **Fit To Play:** This fitness program will be free for those juniors ages 15 and up. It is designed for all (tennis, golf, males and females) to be fun and effective. You will be guided through numerous movement activities covering your entire body (upper, lower and core) to help strengthen and stabilize your body for all your summer activities.

CLUB EVENTS FOR FAMILIES

HOUSE RULES

1. **Access to Clubhouse Facilities:** No junior member shall remain in the clubhouse after the hours of closing, except for special events arranged by the House Committee.
2. **Dogs Not Allowed on the Course:** No junior member shall be allowed to bring a dog into the Clubhouse or onto the grounds.
3. **Care and Responsibility for Club Property:** Property of the Club is not to be taken from the Clubhouse and any breakage or damage must be paid for by the junior member (family) responsible.
4. **Dress Code:** Appropriate golfing and tennis attire must be worn at all times. Proper footwear is required to play tennis.

The following are not acceptable attire at the Club: cut-offs; swimming trunks; tank tops; stenciled tee shirts, sports jerseys or halter tops; sweat pants; spandex outerwear; bare feet; baseball or soccer-type shoes. Only jeans in good decorum are permitted. Junior members not properly attired will not be permitted to play golf or tennis. The Pro Shop has the authority to enforce this dress code rule.

5. **Junior Member's Parents:** The parents of an Annual Junior Member of the club, where such parents are not also Annual Members of the club, are not entitled to any privilege of the Club. They may attend, however, with their junior, the Family BBQ held for all juniors taking lessons. In addition, they may play in the Parent/Child Tournament as a guest of their junior at rates outlined in the Pro Shop.
6. **Playing Guests:** All Junior members are of course encouraged to bring their parents or peers to play but their guests are not entitled to the guest fee rate as outlined in the Annual Schedule of Fees.
7. **House Accounts:** Junior Members from Member and Non-Member families may have House Account signing privileges only if the families have provided the Club with their MasterCard or Visa number and have the parent's authorization. House accounts not paid within 30 days of invoicing will be processed using the credit card number provided. Please note that a 2% interest charge per month will apply to overdue accounts after 30 days.

Intermediate and Junior Members will be subject to payment of an Initiation Fee on reaching 30 years of age. Annual fees will be charged at a rate determined by the Board of Directors each year.

INITIATION FEE DISCOUNTS

Senior Membership Discounts for Continuous Intermediate and Junior Members: The following discounts, recognizing continuous paid membership as an Intermediate and Junior member, will be applied to the initiation fees in place at the time of Senior membership application.

DISCIPLINARY ACTION

The Board of Directors shall have power, by vote of 70% (seventy per cent) or more of those present at a meeting, to expel or suspend from membership any member whose conduct, whether on the Club's premises or elsewhere, shall be considered by the Board of Directors to be improper, unbecoming or likely to endanger the welfare, interest or character of the Club, or who willfully violates or neglects the observances of any rules or regulations provided by the Board of Directors, or by any committee under the authority thereof. No Member shall be expelled, suspended or tried for any such offence without first being notified of the charge against such Member, and given the opportunity to be heard by the Board of Directors at a meeting called for that purpose. Such notification shall be sufficient if mailed to the member's usual place of address by registered letter at least ten days prior to such meeting of the Board of Directors.

If, within a month after the expulsion or suspension of a Member, a Special Meeting of the Club is requested by twenty Members, in writing, addressed to the Secretary, such meeting shall be called forthwith and an appeal thereat may be taken from the decision of the Board of Directors and the Member shall be reinstated by an affirmative vote of 70% of those Members present thereat.

RIGHTS, PRIVILEGES AND DUTIES OF MEMBERS

Only those who are Junior Members of the Club shall be entitled to the privileges thereof. The rights, if any, of a Member in the property and privileges of the Club, shall terminate with the period of his or her membership.

All those who are Junior Members of the Club shall be deemed conclusively to have submitted to and assented to be bound by the Rules and Regulations of the Club and carrying out of any authority vested in the Board of Directors or any committee, and shall conduct themselves in such a manner as not to infringe upon and restrict the rights and privileges of other Members – or in any manner that shall be deemed to be a nuisance or which may be offensive or an annoyance to any other Member, or likely to endanger the interest, welfare or character of the Club.

Any violation of the Liquor License Act R.S.O. 1980 or the regulations there under by a junior Member, or by any person for whom such Member is responsible, shall render such Junior Member liable to suspension for such time and in such manner as the Board of Directors shall determine.

For any penalty or damage which results to the Club for any violation of the provisions of the Liquor License Act R.S.O. 1980 (and or any amendments thereto) or the regulations there under by a Junior Member, Guest of such Member, such Member's family shall fully indemnify the Club of every such penalty and all such damages.

The Club will not be responsible for loss or damage of property of Junior Members or their guests, or for any damage or injuries sustained by them in or about the Clubhouse or Grounds, unless caused by the negligence on the part of the Club, and the Member shall fully indemnify the Club or any claims made by or on behalf of such Guests.

FEES

The fees for the various classes of junior membership shall be determined by the Board of Directors annually and shall be published. Fees for the Junior Members are due and payable on March 1st of every year.

GOLF AND TENNIS RULES AND ETIQUETTE

Junior Members are reminded to repair all ball marks and divots, and to rake all bunkers. Rakes are to be placed outside the bunker after raking.

- 1. Rules of Play:** The Rules of Play are the Rules of Golf as approved by the Royal Canadian Golf Association, except when governed by local rules.
- 2. Definition of "In Season":** The second Saturday of June to the last Sunday of September will define "In Season".

- 3. Adult Accompaniment of Junior Members:** Throughout the season, Junior Members must be accompanied by one Senior Adult Member per tee time booked from opening time up to and including 1:00 p.m. on weekdays and weekends. Additionally, they may only book one starting time per AM Starting Times Reserved for Members.

After 1:00 p.m. junior members may play unaccompanied by an Adult but they must respect the pace of play rules and may be subject to approval by the Head Golf Professional.

- 5. Booking Tee Times:** Junior Members are not permitted to book tee off times before 1:00 on weekdays or weekends (unless they are accompanied by a Senior Adult Member). After 1:00, juniors are allowed to book starting times in person or by telephone at 705-769-3381.
- 6. Pro Shop Authorization Required to Start From Any Tee Other Than The First Tee:** No play shall commence other than on the First Tee without authorization from the Pro Shop.
- 7. Responsibility for Golf Closure to Prevent Course Damage:** In instances where the presence of frost, accumulated precipitation or other results of inclement weather leave the course vulnerable to damage from play, it is the responsibility of the Green Superintendent and in his absence the General Manager/Head Golf Professional, to decide whether to close the course until conditions improve.
- 8. Tee Time Lateness:** Junior Members must have their golfing party ready to tee off at the reserved time. Late participants may join their group on the course or forfeit their time, in which case the Pro Shop will make all efforts to give the booking a later starting time.
- 9. Penalty for Not Canceling Golf Starting Times:** Junior Members who do not show up to golf during the time slot they have booked and who do not contact the Club to cancel their booking will face the following consequences:
- First Offence:* The Junior Member will receive a verbal warning from the Golf Captain.
- Second Offence:* The Junior Member will receive a written warning from the Chair of the Golf Committee.
- Third Offence:* The Junior Member's booking privileges will be suspended for two weeks.
- 10. Soft Spiked Shoes Only:** Only golf shoes with soft spikes are allowed at the Windermere Golf & Country Club.
- 11. Golf Balls:** Members and/or Guests must not purchase golf balls from anyone on the golf course.
- 12. Safe Range:** No player should play until the players in front are out of range.

13. Speed of Play:

a) Course Marshall's Flag System: Over the past couple of years, the Club has increasingly faced incidents of slow play. To help Course Marshalls speed up play on the course, the Board has asked them to display flags on their cars, to indicate to players whether their speed of play is satisfactory. The flag system the Course Marshals will use is as follows:

Green Flag - indicates speed of play is satisfactory

Yellow Flag - indicates the players should speed up play and close the gap between them and the group ahead

Red Flag - indicates that players should pick up their balls and proceed to the next tee.

Junior Members who do not comply with the Course Marshall's directions will receive a Letter of Warning following the first incident of non-compliance, and will be referred to the Board for Disciplinary Action Review following a second incident.

Guests of Junior Members who do not comply with the Course Marshall's directions will be removed from the course.

b) Practices to Speed Play: to promote speed of play the Club's Board has endorsed the following practices.

i) Play when Ready: The Windermere Golf & Country Club endorses a "play when ready" concept. This will speed up play considerably. Play when ready on the fairway and particularly on the green. While your partner or opponent is playing, study your own shot and be ready to play. This procedure will speed up play for all.

ii) Searching for a Ball: Players searching for a ball should allow other players coming up to play through and should not continue play until those players have passed out of range.

iii) Proceeding to Next Hole and Scoring: When the result of a hole has been determined, leave the hole immediately and proceed to the next tee where scoring should occur and golfers play when ready. The Player with the honour should tee off before recording their score.

14. Tennis Rules and Etiquette

Appropriate tennis attire is required. Regulation tennis shoes with non-marking rubber soles must be worn at all times.

Courts may be booked up to 5 days in advance by calling the Pro Shop at 705-769-3381.

There is no restriction on when courts can be reserved, other than during junior and senior clinics and round robins.

LEAVES OF ABSENCE AND DISCIPLINARY ACTION

A Member unable to take advantage of membership privileges in any year for medical reasons or due to residing at too great a distance from the Club may request a "Leave of Absence" on payment of the "Leave of Absence Fee" (25% of the Annual Dues). Intermediates are not charged a Leave of Absence fee while they are full-time students. Leaves of Absence are granted either for medical reasons or distance (residing a minimum of 300 miles or 450 km from the Club), making the Club facilities unavailable to the Member. Special consideration for a Leave of Absence based on other factors requires the approval of the Board of Directors. Leaves of Absence are granted on the condition that the Member does not make use of Club facilities as a Member, Guest of a Member, or through payment of Green Fees or Tennis Fees, for the full season to which the Leave applies. Members granted a Leave of Absence are welcome and encouraged to participate in the social component of Club functions.

All requests for changes in membership must be received by the Secretary prior to the first day of May of the year in which a change in category is solicited.

THE 4-HOUR ROUND: PLAY 'READY GOLF'

(Whether or not you are playing well, play efficiently)

- Tee Off when ready.
- On the Fairway, go directly to your ball if you can do so without being in the line of fire, and be ready to hit.
- On the Green, putt as soon as possible (it is not always necessary to wait until everybody is on the green) and putt out.
- On a cart, do not return a club to your bag until you are making your next club selection. Keep your club with you on the cart until then.
- Keep up to the group in front.
- Pick up your ball after you reach your maximum allowable number of strokes. (For beginners this would be par plus four strokes.)
